Remember that the January meeting is the last opportunity to register your **UFO/COP**. No registrations will be accepted after the evening of the 27th. The deadline for completing and showing a **UFO/COP** is the June meeting.

Because the prize has grown to a much larger amount than anticipated I will ask the guild members attending the January meeting to vote on whether to split the prize into 2 or more prizes.

The program for January is **The Best/Worst Quilting tool I have purchased**. Let's face it ladies most of us are tool junkies. We are always on the lookout for a tool that will help us achieve that perfect ¼", mark a quilt easily, cut fabric faster & straighter, hand quilt without building a callous the size of a small country....you get my drift. Please bring your Best/Worst tool to the meeting and share it with us. You could save us from purchasing yet another tool that doesn't measure up or give us a great reason to buy a tool we haven't tried yet.

I have had requests for another Mystery Quilt program. If there is enough interest I will work on that for the fall. I am also researching a "stash buster" program, I am sure you all have a stash that you would love to use up or at least reduce!

The **Journal Quilt Challenge** begins this month and I am looking forward to seeing what you create. Here are the parameters for your Journal Quilts:

- No larger than 10" x 12" and no smaller than 4" x 5"
- At least 3 layers quilted together in some fashion
- Reflect the challenge set for the month

This is an opportunity for you to explore your creativity and try different techniques. The project is small so it doesn't require a large investment in fabric or other supplies. Mostly it is an opportunity to stretch yourself and have fun. No one is going to judge your creation. Be bold, try things you have never tried before – you have nothing to lose and you may discover something wonderful!

This Month's Challenge:

Using fabric in your favourite colour cut out three different sizes of your favourite geometric shape, and apply them to your background fabric. Stitch and embellish as you wish. Sign & date your quilt and bring it to the February meeting to share with the guild.

- Layer and tie other quilts
- Sew on labels
- Hem on bindings
- Iron and cut fabrics

We do supply fabric, batting and patterns but you could use your own if you prefer.
