FROM YOUR PRESIDENT

Happy Valentine's Day!

Hopefully by the time you read this newsletter there will be some sign of spring despite what the groundhogs say. As this is my last letter to you as president I would like to say how much I have enjoyed getting to know so many of you, and getting to know how our wonderful Guild works.

A question was asked at the January meeting about the \$900 budget for our Website. Janet addressed the question at the meeting but because it has come up before the executive thought it should be addressed here. Every website requires a web host and a domain name. We pay "Look Easy Hosting" \$400 per year to retain our domain name, www.lionsgatequiltersguild.com; rent space on their servers for our website and provide us with a number of e-mail addresses. They maintain the servers and ensure that our website is accessible. In addition to paying for our contract with Look Easy Hosting we pay our webmaster to maintain our website, add monthly newsletters, registration forms, quilt show information etc.

The e-mail addresses have allowed us to maintain consistent e-mail addresses for executive members who are responsible for major guild programs. For example, E-mails that are sent to president@lionsgatequiltersguild.com are automatically routed to my personal e-mail address. When a new president is elected the e-mail address will remain the same but it will

be routed to the new president's personal e-mail address. This provides consistency for members and others who want to contact the guild and maintains the privacy of the members of the executive.

We budget \$55 per month for the webmaster for a total budget of \$900. Last year the webhosting and webmaster services cost \$850, slightly less than the \$900 we have budgeted for 2009. Using the website has enabled us to reduce the cost of mailing newsletters and other documents by about \$2500 per year and significantly lightened the load on the newsletter editor and mailing volunteers.

All of the positions on the new executive have had at least one person step forward except 'Workshops'. Additional volunteers are welcomed, as our AGM includes an election, should more than one person be willing to volunteer to serve on the executive for a 2-year term. The workshops committee organizes our COPS days, as well as arranging a variety of one and two day workshops, at affordable rates, scattered throughout the year. Marg Marlow has already organized the workshops until June. After June there will not be any further workshops until one of our members comes forward to volunteer. If you ever considered being a volunteer, now is the time to step up. There are several volunteers who work on this committee and assist in pulling the events together, so this volunteer position is a great opportunity to work with your fellow guild members to guide and plan these fun and creative events that everyone appreciates and enjoys. Everyone in the Guild will appreciate you and I am sure Marg would be willing to answer all your questions as you learn your role.

FROM YOUR VICE-PRESIDENT

Following the Guild's resolution to change the date of the Annual General Meeting from January to February each year, a review of our Constitution was undertaken. Following is a summary of the changes made. The revised Constitution will be presented at the Annual General Meeting for a vote to accept these changes.

SUMMARY OF 2009 REVISIONS TO CONSTITUTION

1. Annual General Meeting date changed from January to February
Responsibilities of the Board of Directors:

- reference to appointing a Community Quilts Coordinator deleted since it is now a separate Society. Bylaws for the Community Quilts Society attached for reference since all Guild members are also members of the Community Quilts Society.

4. Job Descriptions:

- Secretary - amended to include preparation of a Record of Motions, and the need to file an annual report with the Ministry of Finance as required under the Societies Act.

- Treasurer - included a statement to bill advertisers a year in advance, or other period of time as determined by the Directors.

- Newsletter Editor - revised to reflect the e-mail distribution of the newsletter, and associated electronic procedures.

You will have received an attachment with the entire Constitution for your reference. If you do not receive your newsletter via e-mail, printed copies of the Constitution will be available at the February Annual General Meeting, or if you wish to receive it in advance, please contact the Membership Coordinator, Vicki Digby to have a copy mailed.


COP/UFO registration is now closed and I am VERY pleased to say that we have **311** projects registered and **42** completed projects have already been shown at guild. The enthusiasm for this program has been amazing and I want to thank everyone who has signed up and contributed to the success of the program.

The guild voted on January 27th to divide the COP/UFO money collected into three parts to be awarded as follows:

First Draw: \$ 255.50 Second Draw: \$153.30 Third Draw: \$102.20

I am excited to see Show and Tell over the next few months and all of the registered projects as they are finished.

The **journal quilt challenge** for March is REPETITION. - Choose an object and repeat the representation of that object at least three times on your background fabric. Use any method of applying it that you like, appliquéd, paint, stamping, photo transfer, embroidery etc. What kind of object? That is up to you but some examples might be: leaf, wheel, branch, building, flower etc. The goal is not to attach the actual object but to create a representation of the object on your background fabric. Quilt and Embellish as you wish. Remember – be curious and have fun!


The Membership year is from Feb to the following January. You must be a member in good standing to sign up for workshops and take books out of the library.


Member At Large
