

Art 101 for Quilters, Experimenting with Colour and Design

The idea for this workshop is to give the student a good groundwork in the Basics of Art. We'll look at design and colour principles in a variety of ways. Experimenting with some of these aspects of design will give you food for thought and a stronger foundation for your quilt making, whether you are interested in traditional quilts, or innovative quilts or your interest lies somewhere in between. Arriving to class with an open mind and few expectations of making a "prize winning" quilt will give you the most satisfactory results. Using the tools we are accustomed to (paper and pencil, sewing machines, scissors, and rotary cutters) we will play with the principles of design. The varied schedule of exercises will include (among other things); drawing and colouring – both with pencils and

thread, cutting and piecing, writing, thinking, talking and sharing ideas, appliqu , composition and cutting and pasting. It's a basic art class, so come and have fun learning the basics!

Each class has a maximum number of students the teacher will accept, or the facility allows. Registration begins at 7:00 p.m. before the meeting starts, then again at break. In the event there are more registrants than spots, a draw will be held after last sign-up date, participants will be notified, and supply list and confirmations will be sent out.

The guild has closed the credit card account used for the Boutique at the last two quilt shows. Any revenue to the guild from the Boutique was consumed by ongoing service charges from the account, and the show committee and executive agreed that it was simply too expensive to maintain.

Final numbers for Album of Quilts 2006 are still pending, but despite the tremendous dedication of the show committee and volunteers, neither the show nor the raffle quilt were as financially successful as in former years. This has raised financial concerns, given that we don't want to exhaust the financial cushion that the guild has been fortunate to accumulate over the years.

We are moving to an electronic format for the newsletter, and the executive is working on securing an alternate venue that will be less expensive while meeting our current needs for space, library storage, as well as ambience.

At this time, I am in need of and would greatly appreciate one of the membership stepping forward to provide me (as well as the newsletter editor) some appreciated assistance by taking the on role of organizing the collection of advertising revenue for 2007.

Quilt Surfing

A Quilt Site with A Lot of Personality!

I think quilt designer, author and teacher, Ami “rhymes with salami” Simms, must be great company and a lot of fun at parties. Her humour and personality show all over her website, www.amisimms.com!

I've been surfing Ami's site for a while now, but I just realized that she sells fabric, notions and gifts, along with her patterns and books. The commercial aspects of the website are not the focus, and it has lots of fun treasures for quilters.

Ami is the originator of the “WORST Quilt in the World®” contest, which ran from 1995 to 1997. The winners and runners-up are still on the website, and the quilts and their descriptions are hilarious! I've browsed through them several time and I still crack up. It would be great if this contest still ran regularly. Maybe I'll write to her to lobby for it.

A “Show Me Your STASH!” challenge on the website encourages quilters to send in one photo of their stash. Browsing through these photos made me feel quite virtuous that my stash is housed in one cabinet and an ottoman. The quilters who have sent in photos have rooms full of fabric! Some rival quilt shops! This will be useful if you ever need to convince your partner that you don't have enough fabric. I also pick up a couple of ideas for fabric storage when I finally get a sewing room.

Ami was inspired to start the Alzheimer's Art Quilt Initiative because her mother suffers from the disease. The Initiative takes donations of small art quilts (maximum 9" x 12"), which are auctioned off to raise money for Alzheimer's research. The quilters who donate quilts receive a chance of winning a Bernina Aurora 440. That is enough to get me motivated to try creating a small quilt for this cause. There is also a travelling exhibit of quilts interpreting Alzheimer's disease.

These two sections of the website, along with “QUILTS” on the side bar make up a very satisfying cyber quilt show.

“Watch Your Step!” also provides inspiration with quilt surfers' photos of quilty designs on floors all over the world. I'm going to send in my photos of the mosaic floors at the Wynn Hotel in Las Vegas – they would make beautiful appliqués. And my husband thought I was crazy when I was taking them!

The website also includes many fun and interesting “Tips & Tricks” and “REALLY Useful Links” about quilting and other topics. I guarantee you'll find something you can use.



What a nice change to have 70 people attend our February workshop!!! Everyone seemed to enjoy the days and a lot of work and socializing went on. There were also many more who have been working on quilts at home. We finished the workshop with 80 completed quilts on hand and then were pleasantly surprised to receive 29 more at the guild's general meeting on February 22nd.

Many people helped to make our Community Quilts project succeed.....it started with the planning, the buying (& washing/ironing) of fabric, the making of quilt kits, the laying of quilt tops handed in, the transporting of supplies (in at least 25 tote boxes) to the church, the making of the quilts, the refreshments and the financial contribution from LGQQ. To everyone of you who have helped

The nine gift bags (donated anonymously) that were given out at the workshop during the coffee breaks were enjoyed by the recipients and added an element of fun to the day.

We hope to show the quilts at the APRIL meeting so if you happen to finish yours by then, please bring it to the March meeting or phone me. Otherwise you have until next year . If anyone needs batting to complete their community quilt, please phone me and we will arrange for you to get it.

Here are two of the recipes requested from the workshop. The first one comes from Dorothea Matewish and was it ever good!!! .

CRANBERRY FETA PINWHEELS

1 pkg. (170 gr) Craisins (sweetened dried cranberries)
1 tub (250 gr) spreadable cream cheese
1 cup Feta cheese crumbled (Canadian Feta has less salt)
OR goat cheese
1/4 cup chopped green onions
4 large (or 6 medium) spinach tortillas *

Mix first 4 ingredients well. Divide & spread mixture over tortillas. Roll up tightly, wrap in plastic & refrigerate 1 hour or overnight preferred. To serve, cut in slices - 48 or more.

* you can use other coloured tortillas as well.



Dorie Smith contributed this second recipe. The name is a little misleading as it was the fruit that people noticed most.

Christmas Carrot Loaf (recipe is for 3 loaves)

1 1/2 cup chopped maraschino cherries
1 1/2 cup glazed fruit
1 1/2 cup currants
6 oz. can frozen orange juice
3 cups grated carrots
1 1/4 cup butter or cooking oil
3 cups sugar
7 eggs

2 tsp. baking soda dissolved in 1 tsp. water
1/2 tsp. salt
2 tsp. baking powder
5 cups flour
1 tsp. vanilla

Mix the 3 fruits together. Add orange juice (maybe a little more) and leave overnight. Add carrots. Beat butter, sugar and eggs till fluffy. Add remaining dry ingredients and vanilla and mix well. Then add fruit mixture. Line loaf pans with wax paper and fill. Bake at 350 for 1 1/2 hr. or until done.
