OH JOYFUL CHRISTMAS TREE SKIRT

with Krista Hennebury



Spruce up your evergreen this holiday season with a new dress! This lovely scalloped tree skirt is simple to construct with scrappy strips in bright, modern prints, or equally beautiful in traditional Christmas greens and reds. Choose a white background to accent your brights, or perhaps a dark snowflake print for a nighttime scene. There are also many embellishment opportunities for the pieced treetops; add ribbon bows, button stars or perhaps appliquéd felt snowflakes! Krista will have a sample of her tree skirt at the September meeting.

Participants are free to swap strips at the start of class to build a variety of fabrics for their project, or just come along with their own fabrics ready to go. You'll learn tips for pressing long skinny strips accurately and how to apply a bias binding to those scalloped edges. Some pre-cutting is required so that we can maximize class time and get our tree skirts completely pieced! It's a Christmas project, so you know there's gonna be cookies!!

Start gathering your sewing goodies and plan to do some serious culling of your Sewing Room - This is your opportunity to replace your "Why did I buy this?" fabric with someone's else's gently fondled fabrics!

SEPTEMBER BLOCK OF THE MONTH

All the blocks will be 8 1/2 by 8 1/2 (unfinished) using two colours - not necessarily just two fabrics.

This month the colours are Rusty Orange and Yellowey/Orangey/Gold - Fall colours! The block is a fairly simple Log Cabin block

All the directions and a photo are found below....If you have any difficulties, call Elaine for help. There are lots of books that have great log Cabin directions.

1. Choose two fabrics: Fabric #1 - Yellow/Orangey/Gold
Fabric #2 - Rusty orange (Fat quarters or scraps work well)
2. Cut 6 or 8 1 1/2 inch strips from each colour , measuring about a metre and a half in length.
3. Cut 1 1 1/2 by 1 1/2 inch square from Fabric #1
4. Align a Fabric #2 strip alongside and sew with a scant 1/4 inch seam. Trim and Press toward centre square.
5. Lay another Fabric # 2 strip on the right side of the rectangle made in step 4. Sew, trim and press.
6. Turn the block so the strip you just sewed is on the top. Sew a Fabric #1 strip along the right side.
7. Continue adding strips to the sides, following the pattern that is forming.
8. Square your finished block to 8 1/2 by 8 1/2.


