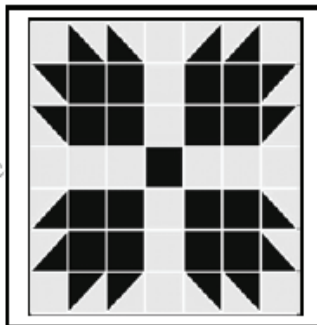

Although Bev has been quilting for seven years, she started out sewing clothes. As a single mom with a full time job, there was not much time even for crafting, other than special holidays like Christmas. Her friend Niomi was a quilter and encouraged her to take a course. Once Bev retired, she took her first sampler course.

The irony is that now she's retired, she still doesn't have much time to quilt because of babysitting her four grandchildren, ranging in age from 22 months to 8 years. When she talks of her grandchildren, you can tell by the warmth in her voice, that this is a job she loves to do. All her grandchildren have I Spy quilts and there is a "girlie" quilt in the planning for the oldest granddaughter. The kids' favourite quilt is a row quilt Bev made at a guild workshop containing pictures of all the grandchildren on it, with the exception of Josh who was still a baby when it was being made. Now that his face is showing more definition, he'll be added in very soon.

With Bev's experience as a librarian in the school system for twenty-three years, becoming librarian for the guild was the best way she could think of to help out and do her part. She is busy weeding through the books to make sure we maintain a wide selection. She thinks it's important to look at all aspects of quilting that people in the guild do and keep them abreast of what's not necessarily new, but what's up and coming in the traditional as well as the innovative fields.

She finds the problems with the library are getting access to the books on a non-guild night and with members not signing out the books. Not that she feels this is happening on purpose, it's just that people get talking and walk away with a book in their hands before they sign it out. She also finds it frustrating when people slip in overdue books without paying for them. Late book fees goes towards purchasing new books.

When asked about the library, Bev concludes "I like having access to the new books and I like the people that we work with. That part is really good."

QUILT SHOW 2006 EDUCATION AREA

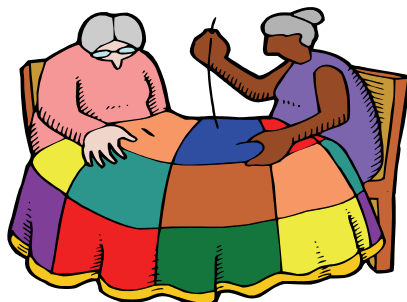

Did you know!

Dry cleaning is NOT RECOMMENDED for your quilts or textile arts because the dry cleaning method involves rough agitation of the quilt inside the dry cleaning machine and the dry cleaning solvents may harm some fabrics.

Febreze or other freshening sprays are not recommended for use on quilts because their long term effects on fabrics is unknown.

Caring for quilts is every quilter's dilemma. How do I clean my quilt? The answer is a varied as the quilts are. Wall hangings, art quilts, baby quilts, bed quilts all present different challenges to the owner. Things to be considered are: types of materials used, are they colorfast, machine or hand quilted, and how dirty are they?

Some quilts only need to be vacuumed with the dusting attachment on your vacuum cleaner. Some quilts could use a good airing for a day. Lay your quilt out flat on a bed sheet in the shade or hang on a fence or deck railing covered by a sheet. Sometimes, it is necessary to wash a quilt and if you do not have access to professional textile conservator, then you have to do it yourself.

The best way to wash a quilt is to soak it. If the quilt is very delicate then extra care must be taken to keep it from stretching and damaging the fabric or stitches. Fill your bathtub with lukewarm water and swish in liquid laundry detergent (without bleach). Lay the quilt on an old bed sheet and lower it into the bath until it is saturated. Let it soak for several hours undisturbed. Drain out the water, and with the quilt still in the bath, fill it again with lukewarm water. Very carefully smooch the quilt around a little bit so that the clean water flows through it. Let it sit again for at least a couple of hours. Repeat this step several times if you can). Bit by bit, smooth the quilt out in the bottom of the bath and then press on it to squeeze out some of the water. Do not bunch it up and wring it out!

Now you need lots of towels and a large area to spread the quilt out (i.e. kitchen floor). Spread lots of clean towels over the floor. Get a friend to help lift the quilt from the tub by grabbing onto the four corners of the bed sheet. Lug it to the kitchen and lay the whole thing out on the towels and cover with more towels. Using your hands, press the whole thing flat to squeeze out more water. Remove the towels and change that wet sheet. Now you can carry the quilt on its fresh sheet to a spot in the shade, or to a room where it can lie flat, undisturbed until it is dry.

For sturdier quilts, a much easier way is to fill your washer with lukewarm water and add detergent. Gently put the quilt into the washer and agitate it for about **two seconds**. Then shut off the machine and leave several hours or overnight to soak. Now switch to the spin cycle to squeeze out the water with centrifugal force. With the quilt still in the washer, fill it up again with water by restarting the wash cycle. Shut off the machine and let it sit to rinse, then spin it as before. Gently lift the quilt out of the washer and spread it out on a clean sheet in the shade or to a room where it can lie flat, undisturbed until it is dry.
