## COMMUNITY QUILTS

Making quilts for the community began in 1992 when 60 of our members got together to make 35 twin size quilts for Emily Murphy House (Sage House today - a home for abused woman and children). At first all fabric and batting was donated by members but since 1996 our guild's quilt shows have provided money to purchase most of the fabric/batting. In addition to Sage House we now give quilts to extended care facilities (Evergreen House & Lynn Valley Care Centre), the peri-natal unit (incubators at LGH) and others on request. In 2007 we delivered 150 quilts which were gratefully received.

We usually hold a two day workshop in February/March for members to work on these quilts. One can come and sew their own quilt or help with layering, tieing or hand-sewing (binding/labels). Time spent could be an hour or one day or two. One could even come and choose fabric to take home to work on. It is an opportunity to get to meet other members, to learn a few 'tricks of the trade' as well as give back to the community. So keep this in mind for next year and plan to join us.

**QUILT CANADA 2008—ST JOHN'S, NL****Kathryn Gillis—Newsletter Editor**



I sent off my registration and began receiving a magazine four times a year that had information about guilds across Canada, patterns, and helpful hints.

I really enjoyed the magazine but eventually I let my membership lapse as I got more involved with LGQG. This is probably a common story with many of us as our busy lives force us to set priorities.


At Fall seminar I was offered a free copy of the Summer edition of *The Canadian Quilter* and I was reminded of how much I enjoyed receiving the magazine in the mail. It has improved in publishing quality considerably since I was last receiving it but it was the articles that really spoke to my quilting heart. Reading about other people, men and women, who share the same passion in this country and finding new tips and ideas to make quilting easier is just great. I immediately sent off my registration.

Our guild is a member of the CQA/ACC so we receive two copies of *The Canadian Quilter* magazine that are kept in the Library. This month's copy also included the registration package for the biennial Quilt Canada Conference—*QC 2008—Quilting of the Edge*, being held in St John's Newfoundland and Labrador June 2-7, 2008. Registration began on October 1, 2007 for individual members and the list of classes looks wonderful; I wish I could go! There is a variety of workshops for all skill levels, taught by both Canadian and international teachers as well as lectures to choose from. I know that many of our guild members also belong to the CQA/ACC and can tell many wonderful stories about past conferences like the one held last May in Kamloops.

This past summer the CQA/ACC had a push to increase its membership numbers. After witnessing the closing of local quilt shops I realize how important it is to support the organizations and businesses that offer us so many services and opportunities. Therefore I encourage other LGQG members who are interested, to have a look at *The Canadian Quilter* magazines in our library and consider joining the Canadian Quilters Association/Association canadienne de la courtepoin.
