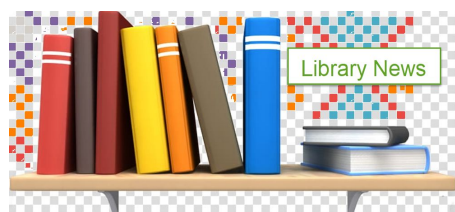

A huge thank you to many of our members for really stepping up this year and putting in extra

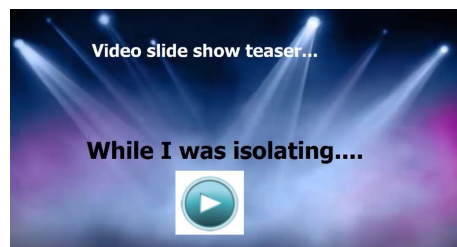

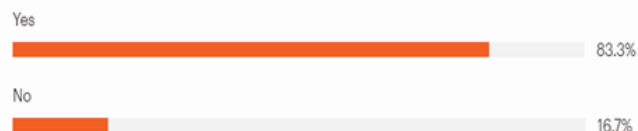

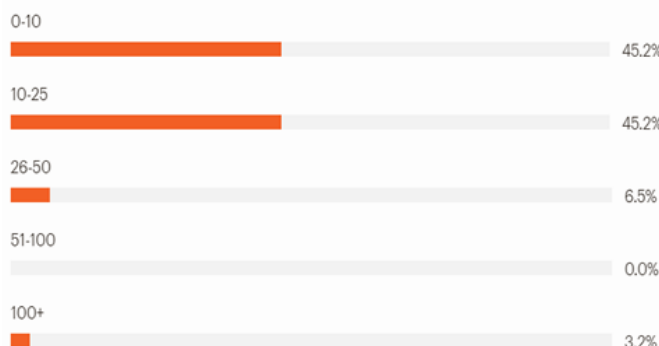


Correlating While Isolating Survey Results. Thank you to all who participated.

Have you made any masks while isolating?



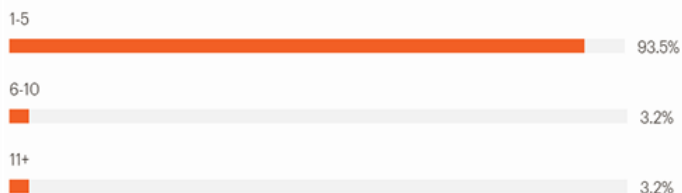
If yes, approximately how many masks have you made?



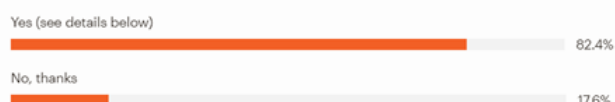
How many UFOs have you completed?

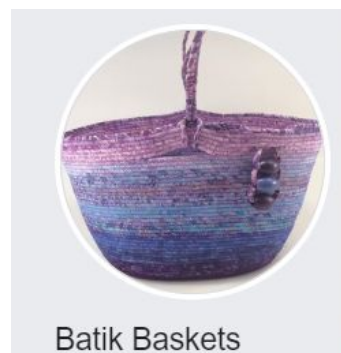
