

DOWELS/SCREW EYES

Screw eyes will be available at the May 28th meeting. Bring your dowels if you need assistance in cutting to length and/or inserting the screw eyes.

QUILT DROP OFF AND PICKUP

Quilt Drop off is on Wednesday June 12th from 6:00pm until 7:45pm at the Capilano University Centre for Sport and Wellness. If you arrive before 6pm, please remain outside until the doors are opened. Once your quilt has been delivered and you have your receipt, please depart.

Boutique items and Challenge Quilts should be dropped off at this time as well.

Quilt Pick up is on Saturday June 15th from 6pm until 6:45pm. Once the show closes please leave the building. We have one hour to strike the show and get your quilts ready for pickup.

Having extra bodies hanging around is a hindrance to progress so please wait outside.

Unsold boutique items and Challenge quilts **must** be picked up at this time as well. There is no support for holding or storing uncollected items. If you cannot make the pick up, please ask a friend to pick up your items for you.

PUBLICITY

Posters, lawn signs, Save the Date Cards will all be available at the May Guild meeting. Ask everywhere you go to (church, mall, store, school etc.,) if you could put up a poster, or leave some Save the Date cards.

Please put our poster (attached to covering email) up on your social media, Facebook, Instagram, Pinterest etc. Ask your online friends to help spread the word. Ask your online retailers to do the same. Sometimes all it takes is just to ask. Posters and Lawn signs should be displayed starting May 30th and removed promptly after the show.
