OCTOBER: CUTTING MADE EASY USING A DIE CUTTER

Are you a new quilter and want to make sure you have accurate sized pieces for making a quilt? Do you want to speed up and be more accurate in your fabric cutting process? Do you have physical limitations that make it difficult to accurately cut your fabric pieces?



If you answered YES to any of these questions, or if you are just interested in how Die Cutting works, then this month's meeting is perfect for you!!

The October Program will feature some of our very talented members instructing us on using Die Cutters available, including the AccuQuilt Go, which is owned by the Guild and is FREE to members to borrow from the Library.

We will have fabric available for demonstration (donated by Community Quilts) and will draw "gift bags" of the fabric cut-outs at the end of the evening. Or if you would like to bring some of your own fabric to try on the different die cutters, then that is fine too.

UFO** CHALLENGE 2024/25

(**UnFinishedObjects)



Yes it's that time of year again! The UFO Challenge begins now and will run through until the May meeting.

Members can add their name to the sign-up sheet at the Programs table at every Guild meeting, listing their quilts name/description and sizes.

If you can't attend a meeting, but want to add your name, please [email me](#) your details to add you to the list.

When you have completed your UFO, either bring it to a Guild meeting for all to admire it at Show & Tell, or if you can't attend, then [email me](#) a photo.

Upon payment of \$2.00 per completed entry, you will be given a ballot to fill in depending on the size (width) of your finished quilt.

All ballots go in the Ballot Box located at the Program table at each meeting:

- Quilts under 24" – one ballot entry
- Quilts 24 – 48" – two ballot entries
- Quilts 48" or more- three ballot entries

Winners (up to 3) will be drawn at the May 27, 2025 meeting and will share in the proceeds of money collected through the year.

It's great way to get started.... and finished... on those UFO's that we all seem to accumulate over time!!

COMMUNITY QUILTS

As you heard at the last meeting, we are now giving out quilts to our many organizations. You also saw about 20 quilts that came in, now available for distribution. Thank you to everyone making these quilts – they are so appreciated by all recipients!!

Please email either Brenda S or Linda H a few days ahead of our meeting day, saying what you need for batting and backings so we can bring suitable ones in the afternoon from 2 to 4 pm (batting bolts are large and heavy so we will only bring what is needed).

We can cut what you have requested and have it ready for you in the evening.

- For batting give your quilt top dimensions and whether you will machine/hand quilt yourself or be using a long-arm machine (more batting is needed for the latter).
- For backings give the dimensions as above and email a picture so we have an idea of what backing fabric to bring.

Thanks again for the wonderful quilts being made and enjoy your quilting time!
