Our upcoming Program events:

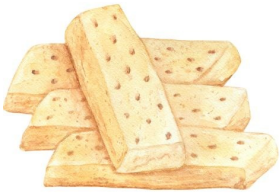

MEMBERS RECIPE



A number of people have complimented Helen J on her **Shortbread** recipe and she has very kindly provided the following recipe:-

Ingredients:

1 lb. Butter
1 cup berry (or regular) sugar
3 cups flour
1 cup rice flour
2 tsp. baking powder

Method:

Cream butter and sugar in electric mixer until smooth. Gradually add flours and baking powder and continue beating for several minutes until well blended. Knead dough until shiny, then roll to 1/4" - 1/2" thick.

300°F oven temperature if you are making cookie-cutter cookies (15 - 20 minutes) but I roll it to approximately 1/2" thick on a baking tray, then mark the top into squares or fingers with a knife - do not cut through. I also use the tines of a fork to mark the top all over. For this method, bake in a 375°F oven for 15 minutes, then lower the temperature to 325°F for another 20 - 30 minutes, or until lightly browned.
